- 1: General Education Core Requirements, see Graduation Requirements section of catalog. Follow the requirements with these stipulations: humanities-select one course from ENGL 2013 or PHIL 2753; social sciences – select one course from HIST 2753 or 2763 and one additional course.
- 2: These courses are used to determine major courses in residency, Graduation Requirements section of this catalog.
- 3: Core English courses, 12 hours. Must take ENGL 3013, 3023, 3033, and 3043.
- 4: English Requirements, 12 hours: Period and Genre: select two courses from ENGL 3223, 3233, 3243, 3343, 4123, 4223, 4243, 4773, or 4793; Cultural Studies: select one course from ENGL 3453, 4103, 4203, 4813, 4903, or 4913. Major Author Study: must take ENGL 4213.
- 5: Requirements for Admission in Teacher Education Program (TEP). Must be completed with required grades for admission requirements. Consult with faculty advisor regarding School of Education admission requirements and for courses taken after admission to the program.
- 6: Must be admitted to the School of Education, Teacher Education Program.
- 7: Students must take ENGL 4213 in the junior fall or junior year spring semester.

Students must earn a C or higher in all courses on the degree plan. Students must maintain a 2.75 cumulative GPA or better. GPA is tracked throughout the program and verified for admission into internship.

Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.

Transfer Course Information

The Arkansas Course Transfer System (ACTS) contains information about the transferability of courses within Arkansas public colleges and universities. Students are guaranteed the transfer of applicable credits and the equitable treatment of the application of credits for the admissions and degree requirements. By signing below it is understood that admission is by application to the Teacher Credential and Standards Committee (TCSC) of the Teacher Education Council (TEC). Applications are available from the School of Education. Once admitted, students must maintain satisfactory progress throughout the completion of the teacher education program according to the criteria cited above and any additional program standards in effect or lose eligibility to continue the program.

Student Degree Program Requirements

A student's degree program requirements are those specified in the catalog in effect at the time of declaration of program major. If not on the Guaranteed 8-semester degree plan, students may choose to meet the program requirements specified in the catalog for a later year from when they began their program of study. Students must meet the above program requirements and the graduation requirements as indicated by institutional and college policy. The program can be changed only with the approval of the official advisor.

If original courses are eliminated, students may be required to meet new curriculum requirements in the degree program. If students are not enrolled for two or more consecutive terms (excluding summer terms), they must re-enter under the program requirements of the current catalog. Students are responsible for understanding program requirements and changes.

Guaranteed 8-Semester Degree Completion Program Pursuant to Act 1014 of 2005, qualified first-time freshmen with a declared major may elect to participate in the guaranteed 8-semester degree completion program. Students must follow the above degree plan and meet all requirements as outlined in the Guaranteed 8-semester Degree Completion Program contract. The contract and this degree plan must be signed and filed with the advisor before the first day of classes for the student's first term of attendance. The official copy of the contract and degree plan are filed in the Records Office.
